Dutch 'Dropping' ideas .

In the Photo hunt variation the group will receive a map with numbered circles. The group receives as many photos as circles on the map. The photos are marked with letters A to ... and correspond with the location on the map. The purpose of this tour is for members to visit all the places you have indicated on the map. This way they discover which photo (letter) belongs to which place (number). Your group decides which route it will follow and in what order it wants to visit the places.

Back Bearing. Consciously lose your way in an unknown environment by tossing a coin at each intersection. For heads you go left, for tails you go right. After a set time of disorientation stop and find our way back (possibly in small groups).

Evening and night tour Simply walking in a forest when it is dark is an unusual experience for many people. You can do such a trip to familiarize the members with the darkness.

Umbrella tour You divide the group into groups of 2 to 3 members. Each group receives an umbrella. You have previously glued a number of numbered tour assignments to the inside of the umbrella. Each group must ensure that everyone remains under the umbrella at all times. The group under the umbrella under which assignment one was placed takes the lead and starts the journey based on the assignment. At the end of the first section, the group with assignment two in its umbrella takes over the lead. The others follow. A seemingly ordinary trip becomes completely different.

Dice tour During a dice tour, the route is not known in advance, the eyes determine where you walk. After walking for a while, for example 45 minutes, you try to find your way back. The number of spots: 1 right, 2 left, 3 straight ahead, 4 back, 5 command and 6 throw again.

Balloon tour

You leave in one large group. You just start walking until you come across a strange figure, all dressed up as... (Martian, Harry Potter, Pikachu, Mickey Mouse, whatever). He gives you a balloon and asks you to pop it. Once you have done that, a photo will fall from the balloon. The photo was taken somewhere nearby. There will always be a child in the group who knows the object in the photo (e.g. a monument). Once you get there you will find another balloon and if you pop it, an assignment will be released. Another figure is hidden somewhere not far away and will appear when the assignment is successful. That figure also has a balloon and so it starts again. At the end, instead of an assignment, you put directions to the classrooms in your balloon. Make sure that your command balloons are securely attached and that they cannot be picked up. Make sure that your assignments and furnishings are tailored to the age of your children. Use your creativity

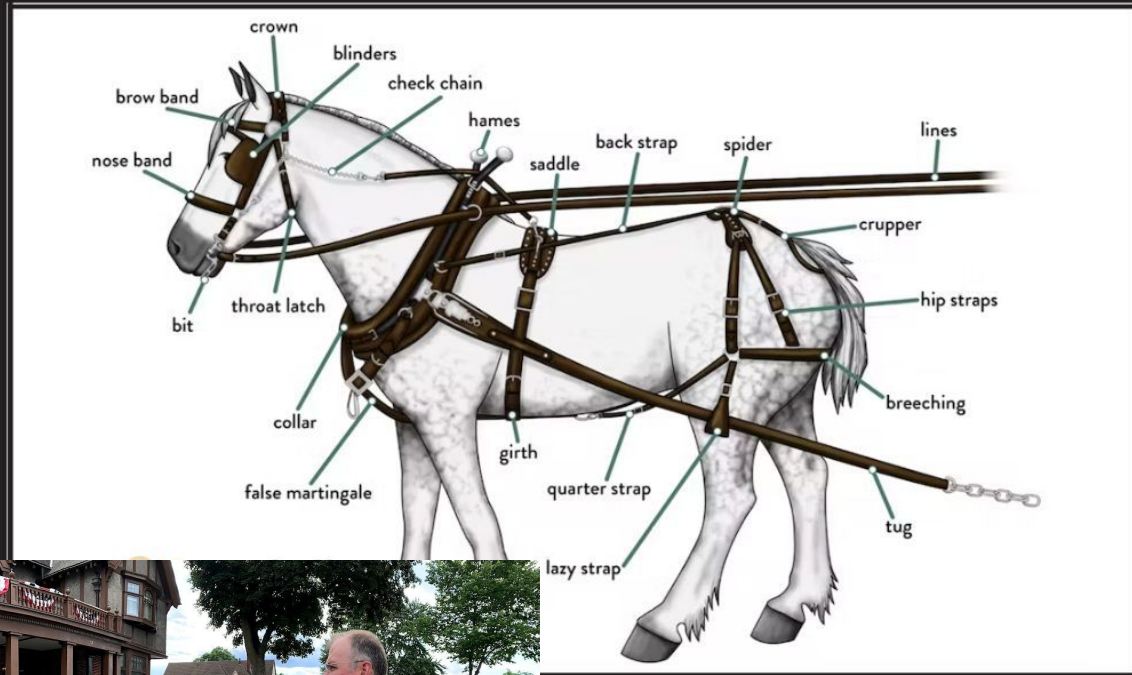

Rats and ravens

Players stand in a line, back to back... One row is the rats, the other the ravens. When the leader says 'rats', the rats run away and the ravens have to try to tap them. The rats are safe once they have crossed a certain boundary. When the leader says 'raven', the ravens run away and the rats follow behind. Make up a story with 'rats' and 'ravens' by telling a story. e.g. Last week I went to my grandma's shed to sniff around, when I opened the door a rrrrat jumped away right at my feet....

Animals on the back

Make as many cards with animal names as there are children, but group them by 'animal family'. An example: sparrow-finch-budgerigar or dolphin-shark-sperm whale, ... Now let everyone find their animal family together, but ... you are not allowed to use words, only gestures and sounds! For example the classification can be mammals, fish, birds, reptiles, and amphibians

Surinamese circle game, "I have lost a ring".

A circle of players hold a rope behind their back with a ring placed around it. One of the players keeps the ring hidden in his fist. The center player tries to locate the ring while the circle players pass the rope around. The players are not allowed to move the ring but let it go around with the rope. If the seeker thinks he knows who is hiding the ring, he can open that player's fist. When he finds the ring, they switch places.

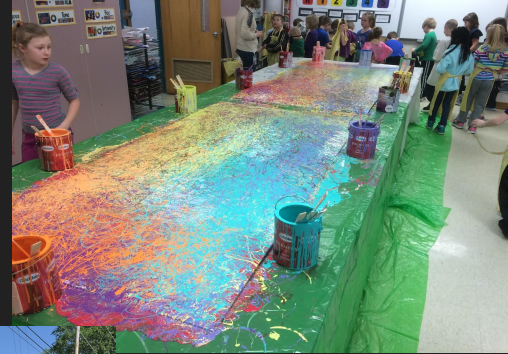

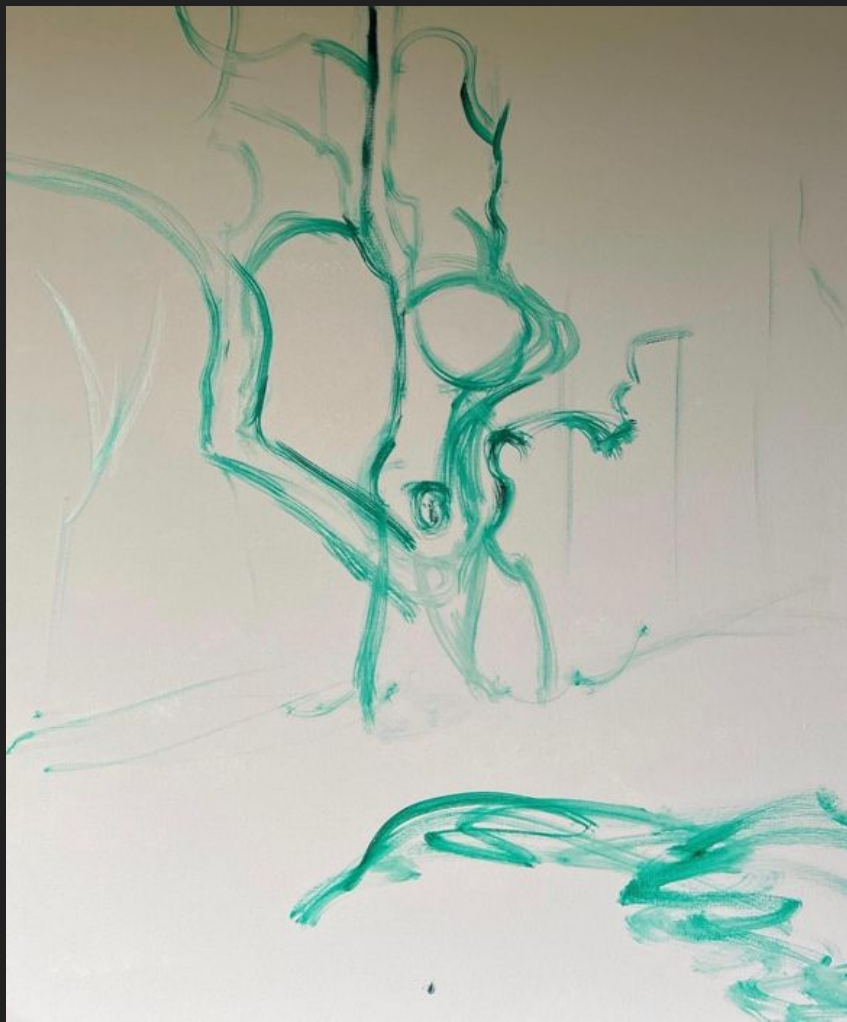

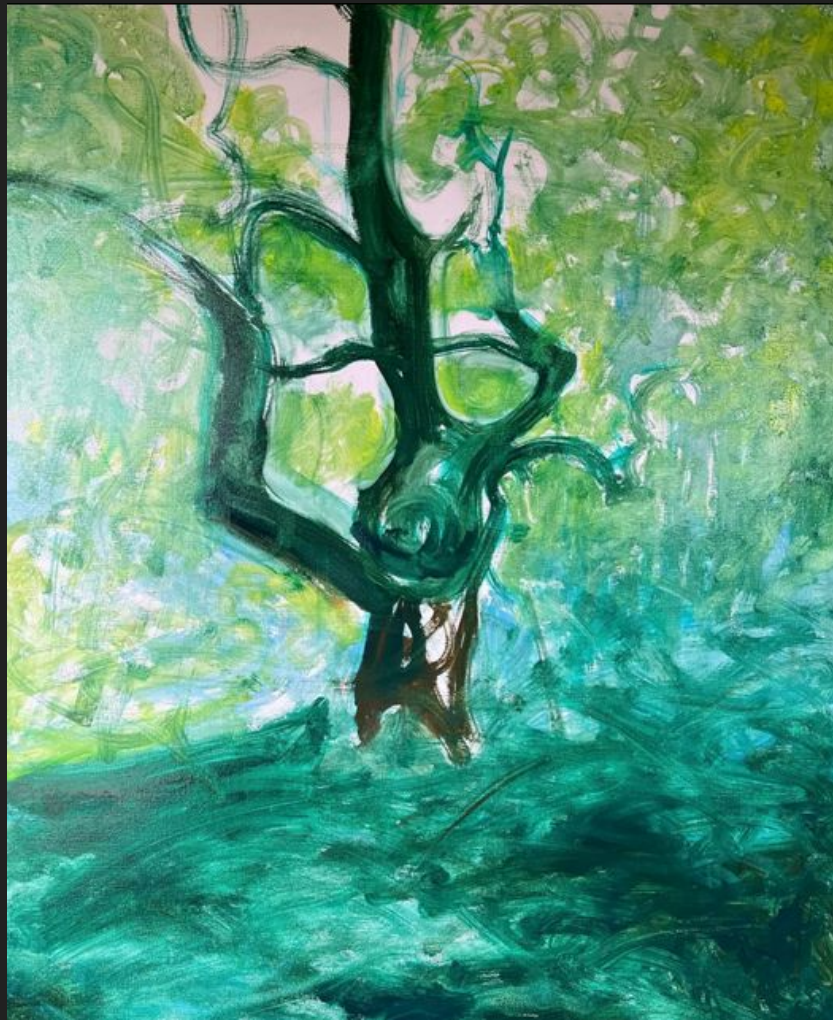
